**WHAT DOES SCOTIABANK DE PUERTO RICO DO WITH YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION?**

<b>Why?</b>	Financial companies choose how they share your personal information. Federal law gives consumers the right to limit some but not all sharing. Federal law also requires us to tell you how we collect, share, and protect your personal information. Please read this notice carefully to understand what we do.
<b>What?</b>	The types of personal information we collect and share depend on the product or service you have with us. This information can include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Social Security number and income</li> <li>• Account balances and payment histories</li> <li>• Credit histories and credit scores</li> </ul>
<b>How?</b>	All financial companies need to share customers’ personal information to run their everyday business. In the section below, we list the reasons financial companies can share their customers’ personal information, the reasons Scotiabank de Puerto Rico chooses to share and whether you can limit this sharing.

<b>Who is providing this notice?</b>	Scotiabank de Puerto Rico and its affiliates: Scotia Insurance de Puerto Rico LLC and the Puerto Rico branches of The Bank of Nova Scotia.

What We Do	
<b>How does Scotiabank de Puerto Rico protect my personal information?</b>	To protect your personal information from unauthorized access and use, we use security measures that comply with federal law. These measures include computer safeguards and secured files and buildings.
<b>How does Scotiabank de Puerto Rico collect my personal information?</b>	We collect your personal information, for example, when you: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Open an account or deposit money</li> <li>• Apply for a loan or use your debit or credit card</li> <li>• Apply for insurance</li> </ul> We also collect your personal information from others, such as credit bureaus, affiliates, or other companies.
<b>Why can't I limit all sharing?</b>	Federal law gives you the right to limit only: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Sharing for affiliates' everyday business purposes—information about your creditworthiness</li> <li>• Affiliates from using your information to market to you</li> <li>• Sharing for nonaffiliates to market to you</li> </ul>
<b>What happens when I limit sharing for an account I hold jointly with someone else?</b>	Your choices will apply to everyone on your account unless you tell us otherwise.

Definitions	
<b>Affiliates</b>	Companies related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <i>Our affiliates include companies with a Scotiabank name and financial companies such as: Scotia Insurance de Puerto Rico LLC and the Puerto Rico branches of The Bank of Nova Scotia.</i></li> </ul>
<b>Nonaffiliates</b>	Companies not related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <i>Scotiabank de Puerto Rico does not share with nonaffiliates so they can market to you.</i></li> </ul>
<b>Joint marketing</b>	A formal agreement between nonaffiliated financial companies that together market financial products or services to you. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <i>Our joint marketing partners include credit reporting agencies, insurance companies and telemarketing companies.</i></li> </ul>
